





Ottawa Collaborative Action Plan

	Priority	Collective Achievements
1	Develop a core set of indicators to use in global forest-related reporting	A Global Core Set of Forest Related Indicators was presented at COFO in July 2018 for Endorsement. FAO hosted a meeting on how to report in November 2018.
2	Report progress on global commitments	The FAO is collecting data and will report on SDG 15 through the 2020 FRA.
3	Integrate C&I into inter-sectoral policy decision-making and planning	FAO has published a set of practical examples and tips regarding the use of C&I for SFM to strengthen results-based management in National Forest Programs
4	Share knowledge and building capacity	A knowledge exchange network of about 300 participants has been established
5	Analyze commonalities and differences among C&I processes	The Montreal Process, ITTO, Forest Europe and FAO endorsed a new Collaborative Forest Resources Questionnaire (CFRQ)
6	Analyze the evolution of SFM indicator processes and the lessons learned	Two journal articles on the evolution of SFM indicator frameworks and lessons learned have been published
